

Brunswick High School Marching Band Boosters  
General Membership Meeting  
December 12, 2005

A general membership meeting of the Brunswick High Marching Band Boosters was held on Monday December 12, 2005 at 7 p.m. In attendance were: Mr. Groen , Howie, Debbie Crutchfield, Dave Porter, Martina Brewbaker, Kathy Calvert, Debbie Patterson, Bernie Tregoe, Bob Cummings, Jim Moler, Kevin McCarthy, Sharon Edelstein and Laurie Kaler

Minutes: Motion by Dave to approve minutes as emailed and supplied at meeting. Second by Kathy Motion Passed

Treasurer's Report: Martina gave account balances and distributed budget summaries.. Bus bills are coming in –will need about \$1200. BOE picked up bill for Festival at Catocin. Candy profit was \$396.80 and wreath sales was \$520.01. Still calculating figures on basket bingo. Train banks was \$925.64 In summary, still need to complete paying for buses, tee shirts (bill not in yet).

Also by executive decision, boosters had to pay Mr. Myers \$350 for music he wrote for Mr. Moran. Also over on percussion for repair of drumhead. Martina checked with Mr. G that we owe Todd Campbell \$150 and Mr. G said no. There is a little money left for music arrangement. At the end of the year, Martina reminded for future bookkeeping that Boosters can make motion on how to dispense any excess funds. It is a good idea to keep about \$12,000 in checking account as a rule. In January dispersement of funds can be planned. The president can send email to alert members of the dispersement before that meeting. Increase parade money to \$300 Motion by Dave to approve Treasurer's Report as amended. Second by Kathy Motion Passes.

Mr. Groen: He is sending an email for parent volunteers to help lead sing a long during concert on stage. Jim Moler and Bernie Tregoe volunteered and Mr. G said Amy would also. He also asked for Christmas decorations to make the stage more festive. Indoor drumline starts on Tues. Music is taken care of. Dues are for trashcans, brooms, etc. expect it to be \$25. Also plan to get tee shirts. As for Indoor Drumline Show, Mrs. Campagnoli said we can have several rooms. Two police officers and cafeteria worker are needed. Mrs. Bonesteel will help update website. Discuss parking at middle school for competition. Reminder that Monday from 5 -8 p.m. small group will be performing at Roy Rogers. Mr. Beaton has lockers in storage that BHS can have. It will secure students' personal belongings. Russ Beaton encourages parents to come to budget meetings at the board of ed. Kevin McCarthy suggests a top ten wish list that parents come up and go as a group in January for Board of Ed and then in May for County Commissioners. There are 25 students interested in choir- a piano will be needed. Concert order will be Jazz ensemble, middle school, Guard and Band.

Current Business:

Basket Bingo-Debbie C. thanked everyone who helped

Girl's Basketball Concessions-Laurie passed around a sign up sheet for parents.

New Business: Nominating Committee-Martina reminds that according to bylaw #6 a nominating committee must make a slate of candidates for January meeting. Debbie C formed a committee of Dave, Kathy and Kevin. They will contact all for nominations. Slate presented in January.

Banquet- to be scheduled in February and will have voting of new officers. For proper amount of time for announcement of slate, date would have to be between Feb. 9 and 28. Debbie C discussed possibility of having a catered dinner for Awards Banquet at Jefferson Ruritan. Price was estimated of \$200 to rent building and \$9 a plate. Debbie will check this out and also it was discussed to reserve cafeteria at BHS .

Taxes-Martina mentioned that to maintain our nonprofit status in good standing and avoid any legal problems. Debbie will pursue this.

Indoor Guard- Howie presented budget for Indoor Guard.It will require a lot of volunteer work by parents. Last year Mr. Moran committed BHS to having an Indoor Guard Show without asking or informing the Boosters and then pulled us out after other schools had already signed up. This hurt BHS' reputation for reliability. Motion by Kevin for Boosters to support show and any profit above \$1500 for the show goes back to the Marching Band fund. Guard would keep the projected \$1,000 profit of consignments at the show. Martina seconds. Motion carries. Dave discussed a separate working account for the show.

The meeting was adjourned at 9 p.m. The next meeting of the BHS Band Boosters will be on Monday January 9, 2006 at 7 p.m.. Nominating committee will present a slate of candidates. All band families are welcome.
