Treasurer's Report: Bob provided budget reports. Recent expenses were bus fees: \$451.55, awards: 339.75, bowling incentive: 445.35, centerpieces and balloons: 122.88, misc.(coffee urns): 83.98, misc (framed photo) 195.15. Total tee shirt revenue: 2,710.00, check from Brunswick City (parade award): 250.00

Next month budget report will be final-Bob will need all receipts, invoices before them. Mr. G will pick awards up.

Expenses made: instruction payment: 325.00, equipment 1820.79, total equipment: 3851.06 , uniforms: 270.60. T-shirts will need to be addressed.

Haven't paid for travel, buses and all instruction.

Motion to accept Treasurer's Report made by Debbie.

Mr. Glidewell: Welcomed all. Concert band --would like to have year round ensemble, Jazz Band would not be a class, but an additional ensemble opportunity. If join concert band, could be in the Jazz band ensemble. Administration is behind this idea. Students are excited. Instruments—looking for a convertible tuba to get more versatility to use for marching and concert band. Good investment at 3399.00 for Yamaha (800 more than

sousaphone) Drum major audition will be May 8. He will ask band booster parent, teacher, and other staff or adult to sit in on auditions. Section leaders will need to provide written responses to various situations that would demonstrate how they would lead. Student and parent would both have to sign regarding section leader duties. Decision will be final.

Staffing for marching band will change because Mr. Glidewell had different needs. He will need a percussion instructor. Need drill designer-not asking Matt Blane back this year. Person that he has in mind is expensive. Keith said we allotted \$2000 for drill design. Mr. Glidewell will also talk with Mr. Beaton. As for instructors, Mr. G would like John Caros, Sarah to do guard, Brian to ~~do drill~~ compose music (corrected at 3/10/08 meeting) and will need percussion instructor and drill writer. Brian isn't available for instruction. John and Mr. G will handle brass and winds. Wants to make transition for kids easier.

Instruments: tenor \$1200, trombone \$550 Yamaha brand since we have no school trombone, \$2200 bari sax.

Will need to check with county to see what they have our inventory listed as.

Drum Major camp- Debbie says Goucher College was good.

8th graders-wondering how many. Keith suggested Mr. Player and Mr. G get together.

Discussed going to Valley and Brunswick Elem and Middle school to reach out.

Discuss focus on Middle School. Guidance is very supportive.

Keith asked if students will be able to do marching band as after school extra curricular

Mr. G says he strongly suggests the students take the class , but would permit it as after school activity .
