Meeting Called to order at 7:00 pm, minutes from January meeting were reviewed.

MOTION

John Morin and Keith Webber made a motion to accept the minutes. Motion carried by a voice vote.

Treasurer's Report: Jim Moler presented the Treasurer's Report. First, he reviewed the 2008 Marching Band Budget – February Report (attachment #1). On the expense side, all \$7,200 for instruction was spent, albeit in different proportions (i.e. different amounts to music arrangement, band, guard, and percussion instruction) than were originally budgeted. The Boosters has received a bill for \$268 for props from Brunswick Hardware, but this does not yet appear on the report. On the income side, the complete \$792.63 has been received from the McDonald's Family Night fundraiser. The Boosters expects to receive about \$220 more in income from band fees. Additionally, there is a situation with several returned checks that may impact the income figures by about \$500. The Boosters should expect a final profit of \$2,700-\$3,200 for the marching season.

Next, Jim reviewed the 2009 Indoor Color Guard Budget – February Report (attachment #2). Denise Hill questioned the \$1,135 listed under Program Ads for the KIDA Show Preliminary Summary of Income. She said that this amount included \$600 which had been received for T-Shirt sponsors. The treasurer's report was not approved – this issue must be resolved first.

Trip Committee: A report on the status of a trip for the 2008/2009 school year was discussed. Three options were presented: (1) A bowling trip to Shenandoah Lanes in Charlestown, WV. This would cost approximately \$9/person for up to 60 people. It would include a \$50 deposit. (2) An amusement park trip to Adventure Park USA in New Market, MD. The rental of the park would be for 4 hours with the final hour closed to band students only. The cost would be \$1647 without food provided or \$2000 with food provided. (3) An amusement park trip to Cedar Point, OH. This trip would include a 2-day pass. The total cost of \$380/person would include bus, hotel for a night, and the park pass. A discussion ensued concerning the cost and the availability of students during May.
